us understand how individuals develop strategy and make policy choices
within material and cultural constraints

how Russian relations with other parts of the world, particularly in the West, influenced Moscow's behavior the region during the Cold War and after

Lectures, discussions, and readings will also place Russian-Eastern European relations in a global perspective, locating their place in the Cold War and post-Cold War world orders.
